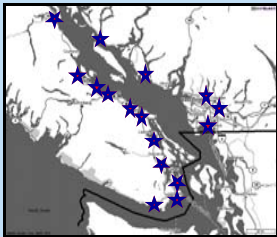
HELP NOW ...

Western Purple Martins - Need Your Help!

For over 200,000 years, these large swallows have made coastal BC their summer home...



but we almost lost them in 1985
--only 5 breeding pairs remained!



True Western Canadians
--genetically distinct from their eastern cousins and found only around the Strait of Georgia.

Endurance flyers--they winter in South America and return every spring – a 20,000 km round trip.

Real survivors--some martins have made this trip for 11 years!



Homeless--we destroyed their natural nesting habitat through our land clearing activities.



Important sentinels--Purple Martins provide an early warning of the impacts of climate change.

Purple Martins are At Risk

Due to **nesting habitat destruction** these birds are totally dependent on man-made nest boxes and human support.

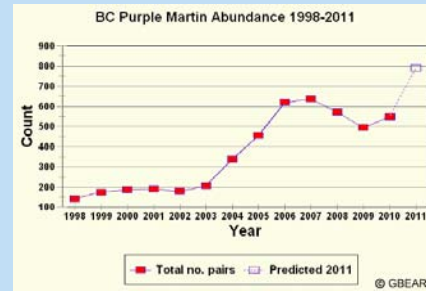


Rain, wind, and cold temperatures can kill chicks and adults — martins are extremely vulnerable to variations in weather.

Although our **successful volunteer driven recovery program** increased the BC population to 635 pairs by 2007,

They are still in danger!

Extended bad weather in 2008 caused a 10% decrease in number of adult pairs and a 40% loss of nestlings.



Working together, we can ensure the survival of these unique BC residents!
